PATIENTS DEMOGRAPHICS REPORT FOR MEDICAL CAMP HELD AT KARIOBANGI SOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL ON 12TH JULY 2014

INTRODUCTION

The Office of the First Lady recently launched the Beyond Zero Foundation to help mothers and children survive and thrive. The foundation's blueprint dubbed 'Beyond Zero Campaign' is catalyzing Government, individuals, health, private and international organizations to reduce Kenya's high rates of maternal and child mortality. An immediate goal is to equip all 47 counties with mobile clinics, so that health services are brought closer to those who need them.

In that regard, 'Friends of Beyond Zero Campaign' would like to give support to the First Lady to actualize the Beyond Zero Campaign. This will be by being involved to identify the key challenges relating to mother, child, and youth in the 47 Counties, to develop strategies to address the identified prioritized issues and to raise funds to implement the prioritized issues.

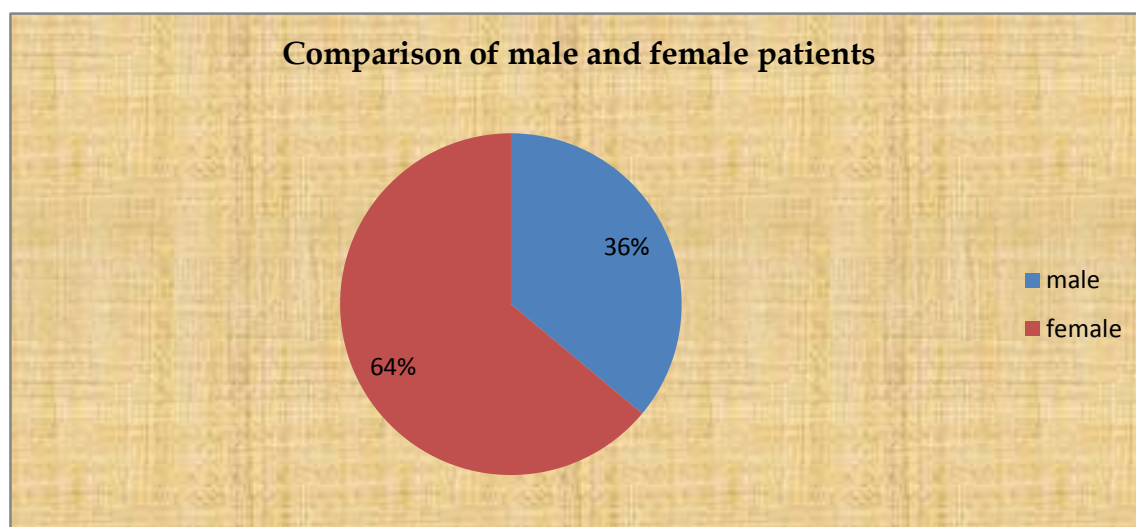
The initial activation by the Friends of beyond Zero Campaign will be to run free medical camps across several counties to bring medical services closer to the people. The first of such medical camps was held on **Saturday, 12th July 2014, at Kariobangi South Primary School from 8:00 a.m. to - 5:00 p.m.** This medical camp benefitted 2,916 patients.

PATIENT DEMOGRAPHICS

A total of 2 916 patients attended the camp among them Female were 1862 representing 64% while male were 1054 representing 36% of the totals

Figure 1: Patients Distribution by Gender

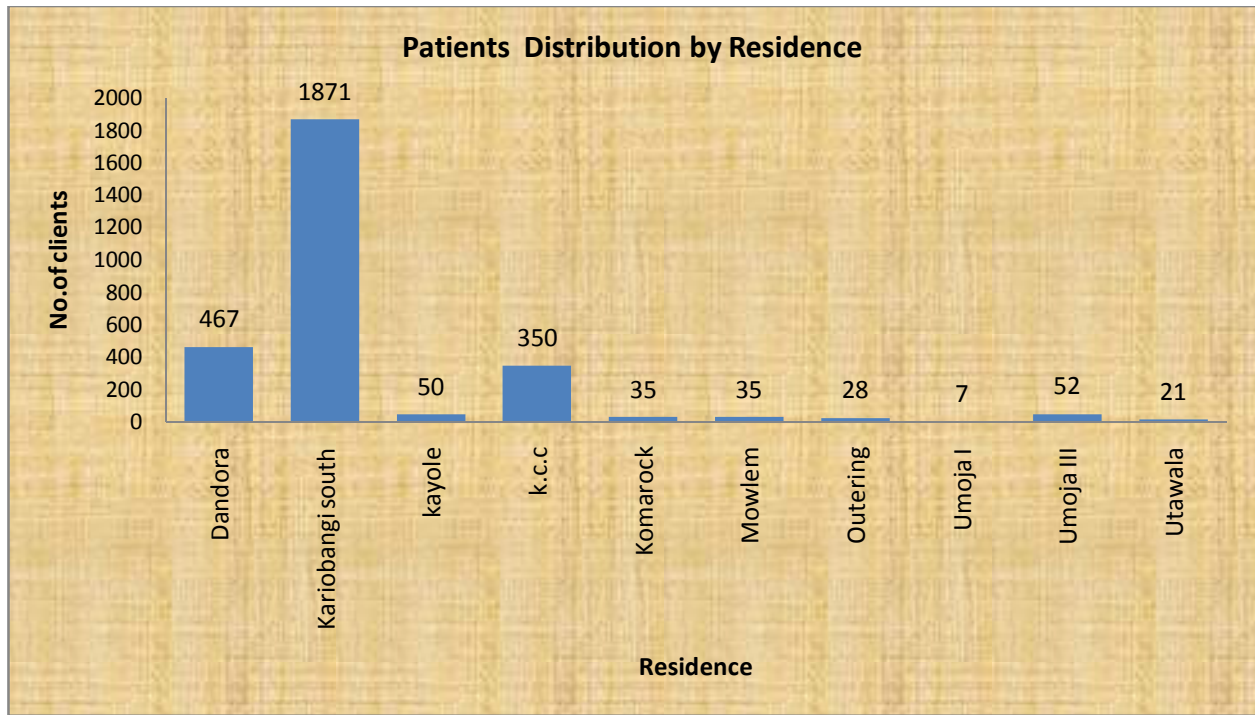
The figure below shows that majority of the patients who attended the camp were female: 64%

Figure 2: Patient's Distribution by Resident

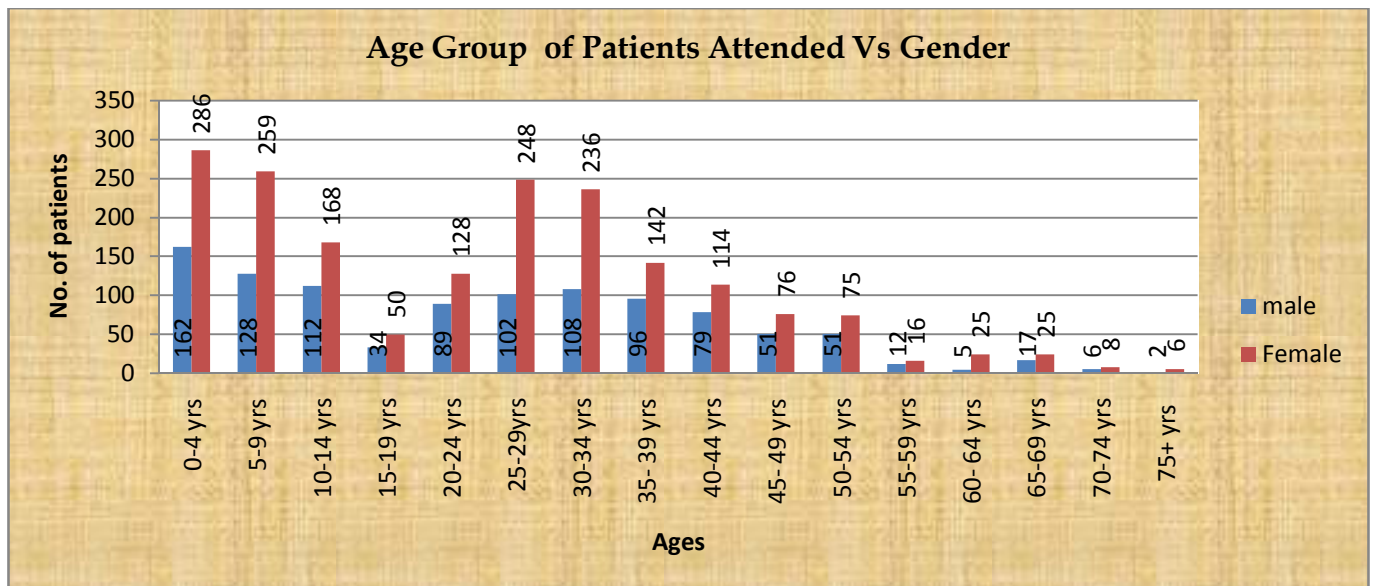
Majority of the patients were from Kariobangi south: 1787 while Umoja I were the least with 7 patients
